## SECOND THOMAS SHOAL – INTERNATIONAL REALTIONS

**News:** China and the Philippines reached a deal to deescalate tensions at the disputed Second Thomas Shoal in the South China Sea.

#### What's in the news?

- It is located approximately 105 nautical miles (195 km) west of Palawan, Philippines.
- It lies within the Philippines' **EEZ** (exclusive economic zone).
- The shoal is part of the Spratly Islands, which are subject to **overlapping territorial claims** by multiple countries, including China, the Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, and Taiwan.
- It is strategically significant due to its location in the **South China Sea**, a major maritime trade route rich in natural resources.

### Geographical features and location.

- It is a submerged reef in the Spratly Islands of the South China Sea.
- It is a tear-drop shaped atoll, 11 nautical miles (20 km; 13 mi) long, from north to south and fringed with coral reefs.
- The **coral rim surrounds a lagoon**, which has depths of up to 27 metres (89 ft).
- **Drying reef patches** are found east and west of the reef rim.





# Disputed claims in the South China Sea



### Coral Reefs of the South China Sea.

- The South China Sea (SCS), a marginal sea in the centre of Southeast Asia, is surrounded by ten Asian nations: China, Taiwan, Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei, Indonesia, Singapore, Vietnam, Thailand and Cambodia.
- The SCS contains over 250 small islands, **atolls**, **cays**, **shoals**, **reefs**, **and sandbars**, most of which have **no indigenous people**.
- The total reef area is **estimated at about 12,000 km2**, or **7% of the world's total reef** surface area.
- Home to an estimated 571 known species of reef corals.



### Threats to these Reefs

- The **Geopolitical situation** hinders the scientific research in this region.
- Over Fishing and use of destructive fishing methods.
- Harvesting of threatened species.
- Shipping: The South China Sea contains the second most used sea lane in the world.
- Oil and gas explorations

## **Mitigation and Solutions**

- Ecologically sustainable fishing.
- Ecologically sustainable tourism.
- Regionally coordinated management arrangements.
- Standardized environmental impact assessment procedures.
