WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

PM Modi met Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah in Brunei's capital Bandar Seri Begawan and stressed the need to respect "freedom of navigation and overflight".

PM Modi's Visit to Brunei and Bilateral Relations:

- **Space Cooperation**: Brunei has supported India's space program by hosting a Telemetry, Tracking, and Command (TTC) station since 2000, which has played a crucial role in India's satellite missions.

Historical Context:

Diplomatic Relations: This visit marks the 40th anniversary of diplomatic ties between India and Brunei. Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah, Brunei's monarch, has visited India four times, reflecting strong bilateral relations.


