NEWS: Afghanistan set to begin work on TAPI pipeline

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

The \$10-billion natural gas pipeline traversing Turkmenistan, Afghanistan, Pakistan, and India is the most significant development project for Taliban authorities since they seized power in 2021

- TAPI Pipeline: Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India (TAPI) project, also called the "Peace Pipeline."
- Length: 1,814 km.
- Gas Capacity: Transports 33 billion cubic meters of natural gas annually.
- Route: Starts at Galkynysh gas field in Turkmenistan, passes through Afghanistan and Pakistan, ends in Fazilka, India.
- Gas Allocation: Afghanistan (5%), Pakistan (47.5%), and India (47.5%).
- **Duration**: 30-year period.
- Goal: Address regional energy deficits and promote economic cooperation.
- Key Milestones:
 - Concept originated in the 1990s.
 - Inter-governmental agreement signed in 2010.
 - Groundbreaking ceremony held in Herat, Afghanistan in 2018.

Funding:

- Financed by the Asian Development Bank (ADB).
- Turkmenistan secured a \$700 million loan from the Islamic Development Bank.
- Initial \$300 million invested by the three other nations.

The project faces security and operational challenges but aims to enhance regional stability and energy connectivity.
