


SANCHI STUPA: ART & CULTURE

NEWS: External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar visited a replica of the East Gate of Sanchi's Great Stupa, displayed in front of the Humboldt Forum Museum in Berlin. This replica, a 1:1 reproduction of the original structure, was unveiled in December 2022, standing almost 10 meters tall and weighing about 150 tonnes.

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

The story of the Great Stupa of Sanchi from Ashokan times to now


- Great Stupa of Sanchi: A Buddhist commemorative monument commissioned by Emperor Ashoka in the 3rd century BCE, located in Sanchi, Madhya Pradesh. It is the largest and oldest stupa within a larger complex of Buddhist monuments.
- Structure: The stupa has a hemispherical mound that originally housed sacred relics of the Buddha. It is topped by a chhatra (umbrella-like structure) symbolizing spiritual protection and the Buddha's presence. The stupa's design was inspired by ancient burial mounds in India.
- Supervision and Support: The construction of the stupa was supervised by Devi, Ashoka's wife, who hailed from Vidisha. It received financial support from the local mercantile community.
- Additional Structures: The Sanchi complex features stupas, temples, monasteries, and other monuments, with some structures built as late as the 12th century CE.
- Four Toranas (Gateways): The four gateways (toranas) are positioned at the four cardinal directions and were constructed in the 1st century BCE during the Satavahana dynasty.





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Each torana consists of **two square pillars** supporting a superstructure with **three architraves** (beams), intricately carved with **scenes from Buddha's life** and **Jataka tales**.



- East Gate: The East Gate of the Great Stupa is the most famous of the four. It was rediscovered in 1818 by British officer Henry Taylor and later restored by John Marshall in the early 20th century, with support from the Begums of Bhopal.
- Replica of East Gate in Europe: In the late 1860s, Lieutenant Henry Hardy Cole made a plaster cast of the East Gate for the Victoria and Albert Museum. Over time, multiple replicas were created, and today, a replica is displayed at the Humboldt Forum in Berlin, made using 3D scanning and modern craftsmanship techniques.
- Cultural Symbolism of the East Gate: The upper architrave depicts the seven Manushi Buddhas (past Buddhas), the middle architrave illustrates Prince Siddhartha's Great Departure, and the lower architrave shows Emperor Ashoka visiting the Bodhi tree,

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where the Buddha attained enlightenment. Other carvings include **shalabhanjikas** (**tree spirits**), **elephants**, **lions**, and **peacocks**.

- **Humboldt Forum**: Opened in **2020** in **Berlin**, the **Humboldt Forum** is a major cultural and museum complex housed in the reconstructed **Berlin Palace**. It serves as a platform for **global cultural exchange**, showcasing **artifacts** from non-European civilizations, including Asian and ethnological collections.
- Architectural Features of Humboldt Forum: The building combines Baroque elements of the original palace with modern architectural designs. It emphasizes sustainability through energy-efficient construction and environmentally friendly practices, symbolizing a blend of history and contemporary innovation.
