**NEWS:** Kaziranga and other protected habitats of the one-horned rhinoceros in Assam recorded an 86% drop in poaching of the herbivore since 2016, Chief Minister said recently.

#### **Greater One-Horned Rhino**

Common Name: Indian Rhinoceros, largest of the three Asian rhino species.

Scientific Name: Rhinoceros unicornis.

## **Distribution**:


- Found in India and Nepal, especially in the Himalayan foothills.
- Historically roamed in the Brahmaputra, Ganges, and Indus River valleys.
- Largest population in **Kaziranga National Park**, Assam, India, with 2,401 rhinos.

Habitat: Semi-aquatic; lives in swamps, forests, riversides, and nutrient-rich mineral licks.

# Physical Features:

- Males weigh around 2,200 kg and stand 170-186 cm tall.
- Single black horn (8-25 inches), with grey-brown skin and armor-like folds.

## Indian Rhino (Greater One-horned Rhino)



Behavior: Solitary, except for females with calves; males defend territories loosely.

**Diet**: Primarily grazes on grasses, but also consumes leaves, branches, fruit, and aquatic plants.

Conservation Status: Listed as Vulnerable on the IUCN Red List.
