NEWS: Rai rolls out 21-point Winter Action Plan to combat air pollution

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS ?

In a bid to combat Delhi's notorious winter pollution, the Minister emphasised the collaborative effort between the government and people to tackle the problem



Nature of the Problem:

- **Post-Monsoon Worsening**: Air pollution worsens due to temperature inversion, trapping pollutants like PM 2.5.
- **Year-Round Issue**: Pollution is a continuous problem, worse in winter but requires year-round efforts.




• **Inequality in Exposure**: Poorer communities face higher pollution risks, lacking resources like air purifiers.

Causes of Air Pollution:

- Year-Round Sources: Biomass burning, vehicular emissions, trash burning, industrial pollution.
- Seasonal Aggravators: Farm stubble burning, festival firecrackers worsen pollution in winter.
- Meteorological Factors: Winter air stagnation and temperature inversion trap pollutants near the ground.

Superficial Solutions:

- **Cloud Seeding**: Induces rain but is a short-term, limited-impact solution with potential unintended effects.
- **Smog Towers**: Large air purifiers with limited reach; their energy use may add to emissions.





Government Initiatives to Control Delhi's Pollution

- Green War Room: A team monitoring 20 government agencies' real-time actions against pollution daily.
- **Green Delhi App**: A mobile app for citizens to report pollution issues like garbage burning, industrial emissions, and traffic congestion.
- **Bio-Decomposer**: A PUSA-developed solution to decompose crop residue without burning, with free spraying in Delhi's farmlands.
- Water Sprinklers: Use of water sprinklers, road sweepers, anti-smog guns, and sprinkling on buildings to reduce dust.
- **Industry Pollution Control**: Monitoring industrial pollution, promoting clean fuels (like PNG), and establishing India's first e-waste eco-park in Delhi.
- **PUC Enforcement**: Ensuring vehicles have Pollution Under Control certificates and banning non-essential trucks from entering the city.
- **Pollution Hotspots**: Identified 21 hotspots with special teams to control pollution sources.



Concrete Solutions:

- **Coordinated Action**: Multi-sector efforts across transport, industry, and agriculture with year-round policies.
- Capacity Building: Stronger institutional frameworks and collaboration among stakeholders.
- **Comprehensive Monitoring**: Expand air quality monitoring beyond cities to rural and industrial areas.

Moving Beyond Quick Fixes:

• Sustained, Science-Based Efforts: Long-term, equitable policies over short-term, technological fixes like cloud seeding and smog towers.
