NEWS: Little Prespa Lake on Albanian-Greek border slowly dying

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

Rising temperatures and increasingly mild winters with little snowfall and a scarcity of precipitation have battered the lake

- Location: On the border of Albania and Greece, with most of it in Greece.
- Transformation: The lake has mostly turned into a marsh, with only 20 hectares of water left.
- Cause of Deterioration: Began in the 1970s when the Devoll River was diverted for irrigation.
- Impact of Climate Change: Rising temperatures and reduced rainfall have worsened the situation.
- Effect on Communities: Fishing has declined, and locals have shifted to livestock farming.
- Abandoned Boats: Symbolize the lake's decline, now found on dry land.
- Future Concern: Experts warn that continued dry winters and hot summers could completely dry out the lake.
