NEWS: Conservation efforts in Assam help tiny, shy pygmy hogs make comeback in the wild

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

Captive breeding and conservation efforts since 1996 have provided pygmy hogs, the smallest wild pig species, its largest home in Assam forests.

Pygmy Hog

- Smallest wild pig species.
- Rediscovered in 1971 at Barnadi Wildlife Sanctuary, Assam.
- Habitat: Tall, dense grasslands with shrubs and trees.
- Behavior: Builds nests with roofs, stays hidden in grass, rarely ventures into the open.
- Distribution: Exclusively in Manas and Barnadi Wildlife Sanctuaries, Assam.
- Size: Males are slightly larger than females.
- Significance: Indicator species reflects specific environmental conditions.
- **Diet**: Omnivorous.
- Threats: Habitat loss, degradation, and illegal hunting.



Conservation Status:

- IUCN: Endangered.
- CITES: Appendix I.
- Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972: Schedule I.
