NEWS: Kaziranga National Park emerges as India's second butterfly diversity hub with 446 species **WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?**

Years of research carried out by Dr Monsoon Jyoti Gogoi, a young scientist from Kaziranga, has brought to the fore that more than 446 butterfly species have been reported from the park.



• Butterfly Diversity and Conservation

Species Count:

- Kaziranga hosts 446 butterfly species, making it the second highest in India, after Namdapha National Park.
- Research:
 - Led by Dr. Monsoon Jyoti Gogoi, this discovery includes 18 new records for India.
- Butterfly Conservation Meet-2024:
 - Held from Sept 27-29, 2024, attracting around 40 participants from various institutions.
 - 85 butterfly species were observed during the event.
 - A new pictorial guidebook was launched, documenting the 446 species.
- Conservation Focus:
 - The meet emphasized the need for **butterfly conservation**, alongside traditional wildlife conservation for Kaziranga's iconic "Big Five."
- Kaziranga National Park Overview:
 - Location: Golaghat and Nagaon Districts, Assam, India.
 - Size: 430 sq km, along the Brahmaputra River.
 - Wildlife: Famous for the **Great Indian one-horned rhinoceros**, tigers, elephants, and bird species.
 - Landscape: Forests, tall elephant grass, marshes, and pools.
- Conservation Significance:
 - Recognized as an Important Bird Area and home to species like Asiatic wild buffalo, swamp deer, and Ganges dolphins.
