NEWS: Union Cabinet Approves Rs 1,000-Crore Venture Fund to Propel India's Space Start-up Ecosystem

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

The Union Cabinet has sanctioned a Rs 1,000-crore venture capital fund aimed at supporting 30-35 space start-ups over the next five years, intending to stimulate private investment and innovation within India's space sector.

Venture Capital Fund:

Definition of Venture Capital (VC):

- Type of private equity financing provided by venture capital firms to startups and emerging businesses with high growth potential.
- In exchange for funding, VC firms receive equity or ownership in the company.

Typical Investors:

 Large organizations such as pension funds, university endowments, and high-networth individuals invest in venture capital funds.

Purpose and Focus:

- Targets early-stage startups with proof of concept needing support for commercialization.
- Provides funding between Rs 10 to Rs 60 crore, based on the growth stage and potential impact on national space capabilities.

Impact on India's Space Market:

- Aims to boost India's space industry, growing its valuation from USD 8.4 billion to USD 44 billion.
- Since 2020's space sector liberalization, 250 space startups have emerged, expected to grow with venture capital support.
- Generates jobs, strengthens supply chains, and develops manufacturing and technical capabilities.

Encourages Innovation and Economic Growth:

- Supports satellite, launch vehicle technology, and space applications, furthering space sector reforms.
- Positions India to compete with other major space-faring nations.

Funding Structure:

- Structured as an alternative investment fund (AIF) regulated by SEBI.
- Professionally managed, starting with Rs 150 crore in the first year, with a gradual increase over time.
- Backed by the Indian Space Association to boost startup growth and attract further investment in India's space ecosystem.
