RANI CHENNAMMA: PERSONALITY IN NEWS

NEWS: Department of Posts issues a Commemorative Stamp to mark 200 Years of Kittur Vijayotsava

Rani Chennamma:

- **Birth**: 1778, in present-day Belagavi district, Karnataka.
- **Role**: Queen of Kittur and early freedom fighter.
- Family: Adopted Shivalingappa as heir after her husband and son's death.
- **Doctrine of Lapse**: British refused to recognize Shivalingappa as heir, leading to conflict.



Kittur Revolt

- Year: 182<mark>4</mark>
- Region: Karnataka
- Parties Involved: Rani Chennamma vs. British East India Company
- Cause: Resistance against British Doctrine of Lapse.
- Outcome: Rani was defeated in the 3rd battle and imprisoned at Bailhongal Fort, where she died in 1829.
- **Significance**: Among the earliest woman-led anti-colonial struggles.

Commemoration

- Kittur Utsava: Held annually in Karnataka to commemorate her initial victory.
- Statue: Unveiled in 2007 at the Indian Parliament Complex.
