**NEWS:** Taiwan opened its third office in India—the Taipei Economic and Cultural Centre (TECC) in Mumbai.

• The first two TECCs were established in New Delhi (1995) and Chennai (2012).

## Preliminary Facts on India-Taiwan Representation

- 1993 Agreement: India and Taiwan mutually agreed to set up unofficial representative offices, with India establishing the India-Taipei Association in Taipei and Taiwan opening the TECC in New Delhi.
- Function of TECC: TECC provides visa services and promotes cultural and economic exchanges between India and Taiwan, similar to offices maintained by the US, Australia, and Russia.



#### China's Position on TECC and Taiwan

• One China Policy: China views Taiwan as part of its territory and upholds the People's Republic of China (PRC) as the only legitimate government.

• India's Acknowledgment of PRC: In 1950, India officially recognized the PRC, making it one of the first countries to do so, and does not formally recognize Taiwan.

# **Development of India-Taiwan Relations**

- **Initial Non-Recognition**: India did not officially recognize Taiwan or the Republic of China after independence.
- 1995 Unofficial Relations: Both countries established representative offices to foster informal relations.
- Strengthening Ties: India and Taiwan have strengthened their relations significantly since the 2000s, especially as India's economic and international influence has grown.

## **Economic Growth and Policy Initiatives**

- Trade Growth: Bilateral trade increased from USD 2 billion in 2006 to USD 8.9 billion in 2021, as noted by Taiwan's Foreign Ministry in 2023.
- Taiwan's New Southbound Policy: Launched in 2016, this policy aims to reduce Taiwan's economic reliance on China by fostering stronger ties with South and Southeast Asia, aligning with India's interest in deeper bilateral engagement.
