Chittaranjan Das (Deshbandhu)



Early Life

- **Birth**: Born on 5 November 1870 in Calcutta to a prominent Baidya Brahman family from Bikrampur, Dhaka (now Bangladesh).
- Family: Son of Bhuban Mohan Das; nephew of social reformer Durga Mohan Das.
- Brahmo Samaj: Family actively involved in Raja Ram Mohan Roy's Brahmo Samaj.
- Marriage: Married four times; spouses included Basanti Devi, Aparna Devi, Chiraranjan Das, and Kalyani Devi.
- Education: Graduated from Presidency College, Calcutta (1890); went to England for higher studies and ICS exam (did not clear).
- Law Studies: Completed law in England; returned to India in 1893.
- London Connections: Befriended Sri Aurobindo, Atul Prasad Sen, and Sarojini Naidu; promoted Dadabhai Naoroji in British Parliament.

Career

- Law Practice: Practiced at Calcutta High Court; defended Brahmabandhab Upadhyay and Bhupendranath Datta on sedition charges.
- Alipore Bomb Case: Gained fame by successfully defending Aurobindo Ghosh (1908).
- **Journalism**: Contributed to *Bande Mataram* with Bipin Chandra Pal and Aurobindo.
- Anushilan Samiti: Actively engaged with the revolutionary group.
- **Politics**: Entered politics in 1917; played a role in electing Annie Besant as Congress President.
- **Village Reconstruction**: Proposed self-reliant village plans in the Calcutta session using Co-Operative Credit Societies and Local Self Government.

Freedom Movement

- Non-Cooperation Movement: Burned European clothes; adopted Khadi and simple living.
- **Newspaper**: Founded *FORWARD*, later renamed *LIBERTY*, with Subhas Chandra Bose as editor.
- Calcutta Mayor: Became the first Mayor of Calcutta Municipal Corporation.
- Congress Leadership: Resigned from INC Presidency at the Gaya session after policy disagreement with Gandhi.
- **Swaraj Party**: Co-founded Swaraj Party with Motilal Nehru in 1923 to challenge British rule through the Legislative Assembly.
- Arrest: Jailed with wife and son for six months in 1921 during the Non-Cooperation Movement.

Later Life and Death

- **Health Decline:** Health worsened in 1925; moved to Darjeeling for recovery.
- Death: Died of fever on 16 June 1925 in Darjeeling; funeral led by Gandhi in Calcutta.

Literary Contributions

- Poetry: Published Malancha and Mala (poetry collections) and Sagar Sangeet in 1913.
- **Journal**: Started monthly *Narayana* with contributions from prominent writers like Sharat Chandra Chattopadhyay and Bipin Chandra Pal.

Legacy

- Public Welfare: Donated Kolkata property, including his home, for the welfare of women.
- Darjeeling Home: His residence, Step Aside, now serves as a Mother and Child Care Centre.
