MAULANA ABUL KALAM AZAD: LEADER IN NEWS

National Education Day

- Observance Date: November 11 is celebrated annually as National Education Day in India.
- **Purpose**: Marks the birth anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, independent India's first Education Minister.
- **Honors**: Azad was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna in 1992.

Early Life and Background

- **Birthplace**: Born in Mecca, Saudi Arabia, in 1888.
- Family Heritage: His mother was an Arab, and his father, Maulana Khairuddin, was a Bengali Muslim with Afghan roots.
- Return to India: The family moved back to Calcutta (now Kolkata) in 1890 when Azad was two years old.

Role in Journalism and Promotion of Hindu-Muslim Unity

- Founding of Al-Hilal (1912):
 - Objective: Established as a weekly Urdu journal to promote Indian nationalism and increase revolutionary recruits among Muslims.
 - Impact: Played a crucial role in fostering Hindu-Muslim harmony following the divisive Morley-Minto reforms.
 - Government Reaction: Banned in 1914 for its perceived secession ist content.
- Launch of Al-Balagh:
 - Objective: Founded as a follow-up to Al-Hilal, aiming to continue promoting Indian nationalism and Hindu-Muslim unity.
 - **Ban and Exile**: Banned in 1916, leading to Azad's exile to Bihar, where he remained until his release in 1920.


Contribution to Education through Jamia Millia Islamia University

- Founding Member (1920): Azad joined the foundation committee to establish Jamia Millia Islamia University in Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh.
- **Relocation to New Delhi**: Helped in shifting the university campus to New Delhi in 1934.
- Campus Tribute: The main gate of the university is named after him in his honor.



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Architect of Independent India's Education System

- Key Contributions as Education Minister (1947-1958):
 - Institution Building: Established premier institutions, including the first IIT, IISc, School of Planning and Architecture, and the University Grants Commission (UGC).
 - Cultural and Literary Foundations: Initiated the Sangeet Natak Academy, Lalit Kala Academy, Sahitya Academy, and the Indian Council for Cultural Relations.
 - Focus Areas:
 - Emphasis on rural education and literacy among the rural poor and girls.
 - Advocacy for universal primary education and adult literacy.

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• Supported diversification of secondary education and vocational training.

Political Involvement and Leadership in the Indian National Congress

- **Joining Congress**: Became a member of the Indian National Congress in 1920.
- Youngest President of INC:
 - Special Session in Delhi (1923): Elected as President of the Congress's special session at the age of 35.
 - **Distinction**: Remains the youngest person to hold the position of Congress President.
