Jivatram Bhagwandas Kripalani (Acharya Kripalani)

Birth: Born on November 11, 1888, in Hyderabad, India (now in Pakistan).

Title 'Acharya': Earned the title around 1922 while teaching at Gujarat Vidyapith, founded by Mahatma Gandhi.

Contribution to India's Freedom Struggle:

- Active in Congress and key movements like the Salt Satyagraha and Quit India Movement.
- Close associate of Mahatma Gandhi, supporting his ideologies.
- Served in India's interim government (1946-47) and Constituent Assembly.

Congress Presidency: Held the presidency of the Indian National Congress during the transfer of power in 1947.

Freedom fighter JB Kripalani was born on Nov 11, 1888

THE MAN WHO COULD HAVE BEEN PM



Had the **second highest** votes, after Sardar Patel, to become independent India's first PM in 1947, but backed down after Gandhiji endorsed Nehru's name

Served as

General Secretary
of the Indian National
Congress from 1934-45
and became its president
in 1946, but left it in
1951 to form the Kisan
Majdoor Praja Party

Was elected to the Lok Sabha

TOUR TIMES - 1952, 1957, 1962 and 1967

In 1963, he moved the first ever No-confidence Motion in the Lok Sabha—against the government for India's defeat to China

Was a staunch critic of the Emergency and was one of the first leaders to be arrested

Post-Independence:

- Criticized policies of Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Gandhi for being against Gandhian values.
- Joined the Swatantra Party, an economically right-wing party.
- Husband of Sucheta Kripalani, India's first female Chief Minister.
