NEWS: Dunlin, a Near Threatened species, spotted during Kerala Bird Race

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

The Dunlin, a small shorebird recently upgraded to **Near Threatened** by the IUCN, was among 192 species recorded during the Kochi Bird Race 2024. The event, coordinated by the Cochin Natural History Society, also highlighted a decline in individual bird counts compared to 2023.

Dunlin Spotted in Kochi Bird Race

Key Observation:

- Dunlin, a small shorebird with a distinctive droopy bill, was among 192 avian species recorded during the Kochi edition of the Kerala Bird Race.
- Spotted at Puthuvype Beach.



Conservation Status Update:

- The IUCN Red List of Threatened Species upgraded the Dunlin's status to Near Threatened (2024) from Least Concern (2023) due to increasing threats to its survival.
- Known for its preference for mudflats and beaches, the bird is often found in large flocks.

Highlights of the Kerala Bird Race (Kochi Edition)

Annual Bird Count:



- A total of **4,885 individual birds** were recorded, significantly lower than **8,639 birds** counted in 2023.
- While the number of species recorded increased slightly to 192 species compared to 187 in 2023, the drop in individual bird numbers prompted discussion among birders.

Interpretation of Results:

- Experts emphasized the need for **long-term observations** to determine population trends.
- A single event's data cannot definitively indicate broader trends in bird populations.

Organizers and Coverage:

- The event was coordinated by the Cochin Natural History Society, in collaboration with the Kerala Agricultural University (Forestry College) and the State Forest and Wildlife Department.
- Birding teams surveyed around 100 locations in Kochi and central Kerala, with 25 teams participating.

Significance of the Event

- The annual bird race provides **critical insights into bird diversity** and the status of avian populations in the region.
- Collaboration between citizen scientists, academic institutions, and forest departments fosters conservation awareness and engagement.
