WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) militants seized Damascus, ending Bashar al-Assad's 13-year rule and diminishing Russian and Iranian influence in Syria. The power shift raises concerns over HTS's Islamist governance and regional stability.

HTS Seizes Damascus: A Turning Point in Syria's Civil War

1. Key Developments

- HTS Seizes Damascus: Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) militants captured Syria's capital, toppling President Bashar al-Assad after 13 years of rule amidst a prolonged civil war.
- Assad Flees to Moscow: Reports confirm that President Assad and his family fled to Russia, marking the end of his regime.

2. Implications of the Power Shift

Diminished Russian and Iranian Influence

- The fall of Assad signifies a major blow to Russia and Iran, who have been his primary allies throughout the conflict.

- HTS, formerly affiliated with al-Qaeda, remains Syria's strongest militant group despite severing ties with al-Qaeda in 2016.
- International concerns mount over the potential for HTS's Islamist governance and its implications for regional stability.


Regional and International Reactions

- Prime Minister Mohammad Ghazi al-Jalali called for **free elections** and initiated discussions with HTS leader Abu Mohammed al-Jolani to form a transitional government.
- The U.S. and regional powers have expressed alarm over HTS's attacks on Kurdish-led forces, who are U.S.-allied in northern Syria.



3. Strategic Cities in the Conflict

Damascus:



• The historic capital, now under HTS control, symbolizes a decisive shift in the power dynamic of the war.

Hama and Homs:

 Hama: The Syrian Army is continuing operations against militants in this city despite significant territorial losses.



• Homs: Captured by HTS militants, marking a pivotal advance in the conflict.

Deraa and Manbij:

- Deraa: In southern Syria, the Army is conducting operations against "terrorist groups" amidst militant advances.
- Manbij: HTS militants are targeting U.S.-allied Kurdish-led forces, raising regional security concerns.

Aleppo and Saydnaya:

- Aleppo: The fall of Syria's largest city to HTS underscores the group's rapid military success.
- Saydnaya: The site of a notorious prison near Damascus where HTS freed detainees during their takeover.

4. Global Concerns

- The rapid rise of HTS and its control over significant Syrian territories raises fears about militant governance and destabilization of the region.
- HTS's expansion threatens U.S. interests, Kurdish forces, and the fragile balance of power in the Middle East.
