



- Bharati knew 32 languages, including Tamil, Telugu, and three foreign languages.
- A proud Tamil scholar, he considered Indian languages equal or superior to English.

- Urged Indians to respect and take pride in their rich linguistic and cultural heritage.
- Emphasized the grandeur of Indian languages like Tamil and Telugu, describing Telugu as "Sundara Telungu."

- Bharati's poetry and ideas continue to inspire youth.
