
NEWS: Assam bird sanctuary records 72% decline in bird species count in 27 years

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

The Bordoibam-Bilmukh Bird Sanctuary (BBBS) in Assam has witnessed a sharp decline in its bird diversity over the last 27 years. A study comparing data from 1997 to 2024 shows that bird species in the sanctuary have decreased by 72%. This alarming trend highlights the urgent need for conservation efforts.

Study Findings

- In 1997, researchers recorded 167 bird species in BBBS.
- By 2011, the number dropped to 133 species.
- In the 2017–2018 survey, only 120 species were found.
- Most recently, in 2022–2024, the number has plummeted to just 47 species.



Key Causes of Decline

1. Overfishing:

- The wetland supports fish populations that are vital for many bird species.
- Excessive fishing depletes this food source, forcing birds to leave or face starvation.



2. **Poaching**:

- Birds like the **lesser whistling duck**, **eastern spotted dove**, and **yellow-footed green pigeon** are often targeted for poaching.
- This directly reduces the bird population.

3. Agricultural Encroachment:

- Farming activities around the wetland reduce available habitat for nesting, shelter, and feeding.
- Encroachment also causes pollution and disruption of natural wetland functions.

4. Excessive Harvesting of Aquatic Plants:

- Plants play a critical role in the ecosystem, supporting smaller species that are part of the food chain.
- Overharvesting disrupts this chain, affecting bird populations dependent on these resources.

Conservation Concerns

- Habitat degradation: Loss of habitat reduces the sanctuary's ability to support diverse bird species.
- Disruption of food chains: A decline in fish and plant populations impacts birds and other wildlife.
- **Declining migratory bird populations**: Migratory birds are particularly vulnerable as they depend on undisturbed habitats for resting and feeding.
- Reduced nutrient cycles: Birds play a key role in nutrient cycling within ecosystems; their decline slows this process.

Broader Context: Assam's Bird Diversity

- Assam is home to about 950 bird species, including 17 endemic species.
- The state has **55 Important Bird and Biodiversity Areas** (**IBAs**) that support its avian population.
