Churn in South and West Asia

South Asia

India faces increasing isolation in its immediate neighborhood:

- Bangladesh: Potential leadership changes could strain India's traditionally strong ties.
- Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bhutan: Relations remain uneasy, influenced by China's growing footprint in the region.
- Maldives: Uncertainty over its political alignment adds to regional instability.
- Pakistan and Afghanistan: Persisting challenges include cross-border terrorism and instability due to Taliban influence.

West Asia

West Asia is undergoing dramatic geopolitical changes:

- Syria: The fall of the Assad regime signals a regional power shift, with Sunni-led groups like Hayat Tahir al-Shams (HTS) gaining prominence.
- Iran: Waning influence threatens Shia groups such as Hezbollah and the pro-Palestine movement.
- Emerging Powers: Israel and Türkiye stand to benefit strategically, while Russia's declining influence reshapes the regional power dynamics.

 These shifts demand India's close monitoring, given its energy and trade dependencies in the region.

Rising Digital Threats

Cybersecurity has emerged as a critical concern, with the frequency and sophistication of cyberattacks increasing alarmingly:

• **Critical Infrastructure at Risk:** National infrastructure faces threats from ransomware and denial-of-service attacks.
