Remodelling the UAE-India aviation partnership

India's rapidly expanding aviation sector

- Indian carriers operate more than 600 flights per week to the UAE, while UAE-based carriers operate more than 500 flights to India, facilitating robust passenger movement between the two countries.
- Despite this high volume of flights, the demand for travel is much higher than the available flight capacity, resulting in high ticket prices and limited travel options.

• Challenges in existing bilateral air service agreements

- Prominent cities in India, such as Surat, Indore, and Visakhapatnam, lack direct air links to the UAE, which hampers business and leisure travel between these destinations.
- Similarly, Indian carriers face challenges in expanding their operations to major UAE hubs like Dubai, creating an imbalance in the distribution of flight services.
- This limited capacity and access result in increased ticket prices and fewer flight options, hindering easy travel for people across both countries.

• Need for a modernized aviation strategy

- With India's growing number of passport holders and increasing travel demand, there is a need for a more progressive and modernized aviation policy.
- Restrictive policies, if not addressed, could lead to further increases in airfare costs and a reduction in travel choices for passengers.
- A stronger, more expansive aviation strategy that aligns with agreements like the Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) can provide significant economic benefits, driving mutual growth for India and the UAE.
- Such strategies could stimulate more investments in the aviation sector and improve both regional and international connectivity, thus benefiting broader economic and social development.

• **Opportunities for UAE-India collaboration in aviation**

- The UAE is ready to support India's expanding aviation sector through investments and partnerships, helping India develop world-class aviation infrastructure.
- Collaborative initiatives may include training Indian pilots, establishing aviation maintenance facilities, and boosting tourism between both countries.
- UAE's involvement in India's UDAN scheme will improve air connectivity in smaller cities, enhancing regional integration and fostering inclusive growth.
- Such partnerships will not only promote mutual economic benefits but also strengthen the overall aviation infrastructure, making it more efficient and sustainable.
