INDIAN – MAURITIUS RELATIONS – INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

NEWS: The Prime Minister paid a state visit to Mauritius, his second since 2015.

He was the Chief Guest at Mauritius' National Day Celebrations on March 12.

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

MOUs Signed

- 1. **Training & Capacity Building**: Agreements were signed to train civil servants and small and medium enterprises (SMEs), enhancing administrative efficiency and economic development in Mauritius.
- 2. **Blue Economy Development**: India and Mauritius agreed to collaborate on sustainable development of marine resources, ensuring long-term benefits from the blue economy.
- 3. **Combating Financial Crimes**: A memorandum was signed to strengthen financial intelligence cooperation and combat illicit financial activities like money laundering.
- 4. **Local Currency Settlement for Trade**: Both countries agreed to facilitate bilateral trade using their respective local currencies, reducing dependence on external currencies and transaction costs.

Indian Rupee Credit Line

- 1. **Project Scope**: India extended a ₹487.6 crore (INR) credit line to Mauritius for replacing its aging water pipeline infrastructure, improving water supply and management.
- 2. **First INR-Based Credit Line**: This marks the first-ever Indian Rupee-denominated credit line to a foreign country, enhancing India's financial engagement with Mauritius.

White-Shipping Agreement

- 1. **Purpose**: A technical agreement was signed to enhance maritime security through the exchange of white-shipping data (information on non-military merchant vessels).
- 2. **Information Sharing**: This facilitates real-time data exchange between India and Mauritius, improving maritime domain awareness and security in the Indian Ocean.

Award Conferred

- 1. **Highest Civilian Honour**: Mauritius conferred the **Grand Commander of the Order of the Star and Key of the Indian Ocean** upon PM Narendra Modi.
- 2. **Significance**: He became the first Indian to receive this prestigious award, recognizing India's strong and enduring relationship with Mauritius.

Vision for the Global South

- 1. Vision MAHASAGAR: PM Modi introduced MAHASAGAR (Mutual And Holistic Advancement for Security And Growth Across Regions) as a strategic initiative for strengthening regional maritime cooperation.
- 2. **Building on Vision SAGAR**: This initiative expands on India's 2015 **SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region)** policy, reinforcing India's leadership in the Indo-Pacific.

About Mauritius

Geographical & Strategic Importance

- 1. **Location**: Mauritius is a strategically positioned island nation in the western Indian Ocean, enhancing its significance in maritime trade routes and security.
- 2. **Proximity to India**: The island is geographically close to India, making it a natural partner for regional cooperation.

Demographics & Colonial History

1. **Population Composition**: Nearly **70% of Mauritius' 1.2 million population** is of Indian origin, fostering strong cultural and historical ties with India.

2. Colonial Past:

- Initially a **French colony**, Mauritius later became a **British possession** before achieving independence.
- The colonial past influences its legal, economic, and administrative systems.

National Day Significance

- 1. **Celebration on March 12**: Mauritius celebrates **National Day on March 12**, commemorating its independence and symbolizing its connection to India's freedom struggle.
- 2. **Gandhian Connection**: The date coincides with **Mahatma Gandhi's Dandi March**, reinforcing Indo-Mauritian ties.



India-Mauritius Bilateral Relations

Diplomatic & Economic Engagement

- 1. **Established Relations**: India and Mauritius formalized diplomatic relations in **1948**, leading to deep economic and cultural ties.
- 2. Trade Statistics (FY 2022-2023):
 - Indian exports to Mauritius: USD 462.69 million
 - Mauritian exports to India: USD 91.50 million
 - Total bilateral trade: USD 554.19 million

Key Economic Agreements

1. **Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA) (1982)**: A treaty to prevent double taxation for non-resident investors, though concerns exist about its misuse.

2. CECPA (2021): The Comprehensive Economic Cooperation and Partnership Agreement (CECPA), India's first trade agreement with an African country, boosts economic integration.

Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)

1. **Major FDI Source**: Mauritius is the **second-largest source of FDI** into India (FY 2023-24), following Singapore, reflecting its role as a key financial hub.

Defence & Security Cooperation

- 1. **Defence Partnership**: India is Mauritius' **preferred defence partner**, supporting its maritime security, capacity building, and equipment acquisition.
- 2. Major Defence Agreements:
 - First Agreement: Transfer of a Dornier aircraft and an Advanced Light Helicopter (Dhruv) to Mauritius on lease.
 - Second Agreement: India extended a \$100 million Line of Credit (LoC) to Mauritius for defence equipment procurement.

Space Cooperation

1. **Joint Satellite Project**: India and Mauritius signed an **MoU in November 2023** to develop a **joint satellite**, strengthening collaboration in space research and technology.

Indian Migration to Mauritius

Under French Rule (1700s)

1. **Early Migration**: Indian artisans and masons from Puducherry were brought to Mauritius by the French colonial administration.

Under British Rule (1834 – Early 1900s)

- 1. Indentured Labor System:
 - Around **500,000 Indian workers** were sent to Mauritius as indentured laborers after slavery was abolished.
 - The majority **settled permanently**, shaping Mauritius' demographic and cultural landscape.

Development & Humanitarian Assistance

Infrastructure Projects

1. Metro Express & Hospitals: India has supported key projects like the Mauritius Metro Express, new hospitals, and infrastructure in Agaléga Island.

Humanitarian Aid

1. **Disaster Relief**: India provided assistance during **Cyclone Chido (2023)**, reinforcing its role as Mauritius' "First Responder" in crises.

Strategic Importance of Mauritius for India

Maritime Security & Trade

1. Strategic Location: Mauritius' location is crucial for India's maritime security, trade routes, and influence in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR).

Agaléga Island's Importance

- 1. **Geographical Position**: The **Agaléga Islands**, located **1,100 km north of Mauritius**, hold strategic importance for India's defence and surveillance operations.
- 2. **Infrastructure Development**: In **2024**, India and Mauritius **jointly inaugurated the airstrip and jetty projects** on the island, further enhancing bilateral security cooperation.

Countering China's Influence

- Chinese Presence in IOR: Strengthening Mauritius-India ties is vital for countering China's growing influence in the Indian Ocean, particularly through its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).
- 2. **China-Mauritius Free Trade Agreement (FTA)**: In **2021**, Mauritius signed an FTA with China, providing China greater economic access and strategic leverage.

Economic Diversification & Trade Expansion

 Trade Imbalances: While bilateral trade remains strong, there is a need to diversify trade baskets and reduce dependence on a few key commodities.

Way Forward

- 1. Strengthening Defence & Security Cooperation:
 - Expand joint military exercises, counterterrorism operations, and maritime security collaborations.
- 2. Deepening Economic Engagement:
 - Explore **new trade avenues** and reduce trade imbalances through policy adjustments.

3. Enhancing People-to-People Ties:

• Promote **cultural exchanges**, **education programs**, **and tourism growth** to reinforce long-term ties.
