A school closure that must be called out

### **Issue with Gondi School**:

- Maharashtra's only Gondi-medium school in Mohgaon village faces a threat of closure.
- The school was established in 2019 to provide primary education to tribal students in their mother tongue, Gondi.

# **Constitutional Rights:**

- The school aligns with Article 29 (right to preserve languages and culture) and Article 350(A) (right to education in mother tongue).
- However, the Right to Education Act (RTE), 2009 lacks provisions for tribal languages like Gondi.

### Gondi Language Overview:

- Gondi is spoken by over 2.9 million people across multiple states.
- It is not included in the Eighth Schedule of the Indian Constitution, limiting its recognition and protection.

## **Government's Argument for Closure:**

- The government argues that without recognition under RTE, the school cannot meet educational standards and students might struggle to transition to higher education.
- The suggestion is to absorb students into other schools, ignoring the importance of language and culture.

## **Bureaucratic and Systemic Issues:**

- The issue goes beyond procedural matters and reflects the subordination of Adivasi communities, particularly their language and culture.
- This is part of the broader socio-political bias against tribal languages.

### **Nehru's Vision for Tribal Communities:**

- Nehru believed that tribal communities should grow while preserving their traditions and identities.
- The Constitution provides protections for tribal communities, allowing them to participate in nation-building without losing their culture.

### **Forces Threatening Tribal Identity:**



- Both secular and religious forces push tribal communities into mainstream society, leading to a loss of cultural practices and spiritual traditions.
- These forces weaken the tribal identity, threatening the survival of indigenous cultures and languages.

## Niyamgiri Case:

The Supreme Court ruled against a bauxite mining project in Odisha after the local tribes unanimously opposed it, protecting their sacred land rights.

## Importance of Adivasi Languages:

- Adivasi communities have oral traditions that are under threat due to deforestation, urbanization, and market pressures.
- The loss of a tribal language could erase an entire cultural identity, making the protection of these languages vital.

### Constitutional Moral Failure:

- While Sanskrit, spoken by a small number of people, is promoted in the Constitution, Gondi, spoken by millions, lacks state-level recognition and support.
- This disparity highlights a moral failure in the protection of Adivasi languages.

- The Gondi-medium school should be recognized and expanded across India.
- Gondi should be included in the **Eighth Schedule** of the Constitution.
- Policies should be implemented to promote and preserve tribal languages and cultures through tribal-led educational initiatives.
