WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

The Union Government inaugurated the headquarters of the National Turmeric Board in Telangana to boost turmeric research, value addition, exports, and farmer welfare, aiming for \$1 billion exports by 2030. The board will also ensure quality control, crop insurance, and promote the medicinal value of turmeric.

Context: Inauguration of National Turmeric Board (NTB)

- The Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation inaugurated the headquarters of the National Turmeric Board in Nizamabad, Telangana.
- The Government of India has set a **target of achieving \$1 billion in turmeric exports by 2030**.

National Turmeric Board (NTB): Overview

1. Objective

- The board aims at the **overall development**, value chain enhancement, and global trade expansion of the turmeric sector in India.
- It will help improve quality, research, exports, marketing, and farmer welfare.

2. Headquarters

• Located in Nizamabad, Telangana – a key turmeric cultivation belt.

3. Composition of the Board

- Includes members from:
 - Central Ministries:
 - Ministry of AYUSH
 - Department of Pharmaceuticals
 - Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare
 - Department of Commerce
 - States:
 - Maharashtra
 - Telangana
 - Meghalaya (Lakadong Turmeric)

- Representation from states will be **rotational**
- Others:
 - Exporters
 - Producer organizations
 - Farmer representatives

4. Significance

- The government will:
 - Allocate special budgetary funds for NTB
 - Set up a price stabilization fund to reduce farmer distress
 - Ensure **crop insurance** for turmeric farmers against natural calamities
 - Promote India's leadership in turmeric-based wellness and export markets

Functions of the National Turmeric Board

- Research and Development:
 - Promote innovation in turmeric varieties and value-added products.
 - Encourage scientific studies on turmeric's health and industrial applications.
- Value Addition and Exports:
 - Support creation and export of **processed turmeric products**.
 - Enhance India's **branding and presence** in the global spice market.
- Market Awareness:
 - Publicize the medicinal and wellness properties of turmeric.
 - Tap into the global nutraceutical and Ayurveda market.

• Production and Logistics:

- Identify methods to increase yield and optimize cultivation practices.
- Improve post-harvest handling, processing, supply chains, and export logistics.
- Quality Control:
 - Ensure standardization and safety of turmeric products.
 - Encourage traceability and certification systems to improve consumer trust.

About Turmeric (Curcuma longa)

1. Botanical and Biological Details

- Botanical name: Curcuma longa
- Family: *Zingiberaceae* (Ginger family)
- Plant Type: Perennial, rhizomatous, and herbaceous
- Native to: Indian subcontinent and Southeast Asia

2. Medicinal Properties

- Considered a **"wonder drug"** globally
- Possesses anti-viral, anti-inflammatory, anti-cancer, and antioxidant qualities
- Widely used in Ayurveda, home remedies, and modern nutraceuticals

Turmeric Production and Exports in India

1. Production Leadership

- India is the largest producer, consumer, and exporter of turmeric globally.
- Produces over 30 varieties of turmeric across the country.

2. Area and Volume

- Cultivated in nearly **20 states**.
- Maharashtra is the largest producer by volume.
- **Telangana** has the **highest acreage** (area under cultivation).
- In 2023–24, India produced **10.74 lakh tonnes**, accounting for **over 70% of global production**.

3. Export Performance (2023–24)

- 1.62 lakh tonnes exported
- Total export value: **\$226.5 million**
- India holds a 62% share in global turmeric trade
