## WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

The 17th BRICS Summit (2025) in Brazil marks the first major meeting of the expanded 10member grouping, focusing on Global South cooperation, de-dollarisation, and institutional reforms.India plays a key role in shaping BRICS priorities like AI governance, strategic autonomy, and multipolar global order.

#### **Context and Background**

- Brazil is hosting the 17th BRICS Summit in 2025.
- This is the first major summit of the newly expanded **11-member BRICS** bloc.
- The focus is on **Global South cooperation**, inclusive development, and governance reform.

#### **About BRICS**

- Nature: An informal intergovernmental grouping of emerging economies promoting political, economic, and developmental cooperation.
- Original Members: Brazil, Russia, India, and China (BRIC); South Africa joined in 2010, forming BRICS.
- Recent Expansion (2024):
  - New Members: Iran, UAE, Egypt, Ethiopia
  - Saudi Arabia: Invited but membership not yet formalized.
  - Argentina: Withdrew its decision to join.
  - Total Confirmed Members as of 2025: 10, pending one (Saudi Arabia).
- First BRICS Summit: 2009 in Yekaterinburg, Russia.

#### **Demographic and Economic Significance**

- Represents 46% of the global population.
- Accounts for around **35% of global GDP**, expected to rise with potential inclusion of economies like **Indonesia**.
- Major energy producers (Russia, Iran, UAE, Saudi Arabia) and consumer economies (India, China).

## **Geopolitical Role**

- Acts as a **counterweight to Western-led groupings** like the G7.
- Promotes a **multipolar world order** based on sovereignty, equity, and non-interference.
- Seeks to **reform global governance institutions** like the UN Security Council, IMF, and World Bank.

# **Key Priorities and Strategic Vision**

- 1. De-dollarisation & Financial Sovereignty:
  - Promoting trade in local currencies.
  - Launch of **BRICS Pay** digital payment platform.
  - Developing an alternative reserve currency or basket system.

- Advocates changes in **Bretton Woods Institutions** to give more voice to the Global South.
- Supports expansion and restructuring of UNSC to include developing nations.

# 3. Inclusivity and Sustainable Development:

- Focus on health equity, climate resilience, and SDG-aligned financing.
- Greater investment in **green technologies**, education, and infrastructure for the Global South.

## 4. Strategic Autonomy and South–South Cooperation:

- Encourages independent foreign policies, reducing reliance on any single power.
- Strengthens horizontal partnerships across the developing world.
