NEWS: In January 2025, Kappad Beach in Kozhikode and Chal Beach in Kannur, both located in Kerala, received the prestigious Blue Flag certification from the Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE), Denmark.

India's First Blue Flag Beach: Chandrabhaga Beach (Odisha)

- 1. India's first Blue Flag certified beach was Chandrabhaga Beach, located in Odisha.

What is Blue Flag Certification?

 - 1. Water Quality: Ensuring that the water at the beach meets environmental standards.
 - 2. Environmental Education and Information: Educating the public about sustainability and environmental issues.
 - 3. Environmental Management: Implementing practices to protect the environment, manage waste, and conserve resources.
 - 4. Safety and Services: Making sure the beaches are safe, clean, and provide necessary amenities for tourists.

Benefits to Kerala's Tourism

- 1. Global Appeal: The Blue Flag certification increases Kerala's attractiveness to ecoconscious travelers who care about sustainability.
 - a. It also highlights Kerala's commitment to **Responsible Tourism** (RT), where ecofriendly initiatives at **Kappad** and **Chal** beaches set examples of how tourism and environmental conservation can go hand in hand.
