WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

India has become the 7th largest coffee producer globally, with exports nearly doubling to \$1.29 billion in the last financial year due to increased global demand and rising domestic consumption driven by café culture and value-added products.

1. Historical Context of Coffee in India

- Coffee was introduced in India in **1600 AD** by Baba Budan, who planted seven seeds of Mocha coffee in Karnataka's Baba Budan Giris.
- Commercial cultivation began in the 18th century, initiated by British entrepreneurs.

2. Global Position and Export Performance

- India ranks as the 7th largest coffee producer globally.
- **Exports Growth:**
 - In FY 2023, exports reached \$1.29 billion, nearly doubling from \$719 million in 2020-21.
 - Key Importers: Italy, Belgium, and Russia.
- Export Focus:
 - India primarily exports unroasted coffee beans.
 - There is increasing global demand for value-added products like roasted and instant coffee.

3. Domestic Coffee Consumption Trends

- Factors driving increased domestic coffee consumption:
 - Rise of **café culture** with international chains like Starbucks and Café Coffee Day.
 - Higher disposable incomes and urbanization.
 - Shift in preference towards coffee over tea, especially among younger generations.


4. Coffee Production in India

• Types Produced:

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- Arabica: Known for its mild flavor and aroma.
- **Robusta:** Hardier with a stronger taste, used in instant coffee.
- Production Areas:
 - Traditional regions: Western Ghats (Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu).
 - Non-traditional regions: Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, and North-East India.
- Leading States:
 - Karnataka contributes the most, followed by Kerala and Tamil Nadu.



5. Climatic and Agricultural Practices

- Ideal Climatic Conditions:
 - Temperature range: 15°C to 24°C.
 - Susceptible to extreme temperatures.
- Shade-Grown Coffee:
 - Two-tier mixed shade canopy with leguminous trees.
 - Benefits: Prevents soil erosion, enriches soil, and stabilizes temperature fluctuations.

6. Coffee Board of India

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- Established under the Coffee Act VII of 1942.
- Functions under the **Ministry of Commerce and Industry**.
- Composition:
 - 33 members, including the Chairman and the Secretary & CEO.
- **Role:** Promotes coffee production, research, and export initiatives in India.
