

RUSSIA-SYRIA TALKS: INTERNATIONAL RELATION

NEWS: Russia, Syria to hold further talks on Russian military bases in Syria, TASS reports

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

Russia is holding discussions with Syria's new de facto leader, Mohammed al-Jolani, after **Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS)** ended Assad's 50-year rule. The key issue revolves around Russia's strategic military bases in Syria and HTS's demands, including Assad's handover and reconstruction support.



1. Background: The Syrian Civil War & Russian Intervention

- Civil War Begins (2011): Sparked by Arab Spring protests against Bashar al-Assad's regime.
- **Rise of Opposition Groups:**
 - Free Syrian Army (FSA): Secular rebels.
 - Jabhat al-Nusra (Al-Qaeda affiliate): Later rebranded as HTS.
 - Islamic State (IS): Extremist jihadist group.
- Russian Intervention (2015):
 - Assad was on the brink of collapse, controlling only Damascus and coastal areas.
 - Russia, Iran, and Hezbollah supported Assad's forces.
 - Major victories: Aleppo (2016), Homs, and Eastern Ghouta.

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• Frozen Conflict (Post-2016): Assad retained power, but Syria remained unstable.

2. Recent Developments: Fall of Assad & Rise of HTS

- HTS Captures Damascus (2024):
 - Assad fled to Russia after five decades of family rule ended.
 - HTS, led by Mohammed al-Jolani, declared control.
- Power Shift:
 - HTS vs. Russia: Russia previously fought against HTS but now negotiates with it.
 - **HTS seeks legitimacy** as Syria's new governing force.

3. Russia's Strategic Interests in Syria

- Military Bases:
 - Tartous Naval Base: Russia's only Mediterranean naval base, key for regional dominance.
 - Hmeimim Air Base: Crucial for air operations.
- Geopolitical Influence:
 - Russia wants to retain its presence despite Assad's fall.
 - Negotiating with HTS to secure its long-term role in Syria.

4. Demands from Syria's New Leadership

- HTS's Conditions for Russia:
 - 1. Handing over Bashar al-Assad to Syrian authorities.
 - 2. Reconstruction Support: Russia must aid infrastructure rebuilding to regain trust.
 - 3. Economic Compensation for past war damage.
