### On tackling ideology behind terror, we can't hit pause

1. Trigger: Pahalgam Terrorist Attack (April 22, 2025)

- A terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Kashmir Valley, resulted in the death of 26 Indian tourists, marking one of the deadliest attacks in recent years.
- The Indian government, led by the Prime Minister, responded with firm resolve, addressing the nation in English a symbolic act intended for international audiences, reinforcing India's global stance against terrorism.
- PM stated unequivocally that **India would track and punish terrorists and their** supporters, directly blaming cross-border terrorism for the attack.

#### 2. Pakistan's Reaction and Pattern of Hostility

- Pakistan responded with a threatening tone, warning that any attempt by India to reconsider or disrupt the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) would be seen as an "Act of War".
- **Historical animosity** has long defined the bilateral relationship:
  - Full-scale wars in 1947–48, 1965, and 1971
  - The Kargil conflict in 1999
  - Repeated terror incidents allegedly backed by Pakistan-based terror groups
- Pakistan has consistently denied involvement, often dismissing India's claims as internal security failures, as seen in recent statements denying connection to the Pahalgam attack.

#### 3. Shift in India's Internal and Political Response

- Unlike past attacks like Pulwama (2019), the current situation has witnessed a unified political response across party lines and ideologies.
- The **Jammu and Kashmir region**, often marked by local political divides, saw **public protests against terrorism**, suggesting a shift in **local sentiment** toward national unity.
- This **consensus-based response** is being hailed as a significant development in India's **domestic counter-terrorism narrative**.

## 4. Ongoing Challenges in Counter-Terrorism

- Security Measures:
  - India has successfully **weakened terror infrastructure**, especially **outside of Jammu and Kashmir**, through **surveillance**, **intelligence**, **and strikes**.
- Ideological and Institutional Challenges:
  - However, the ideology, indoctrination, and mindset that fuel terrorism continue to persist, especially in cross-border networks.
  - Eliminating terror operatives does not necessarily dismantle the **ecosystem of radicalization and support**.
- Continuous Threat:
  - The idea of a "permanent solution" to terrorism is seen as unrealistic by many experts.
  - Counter-terrorism is a continuous process, requiring vigilance, adaptive strategy, and global cooperation.

# 5. India's International Strategy and Messaging

- The Prime Minister's address in English was designed to mobilize international opinion and demonstrate India's maturity and resolve.
- India seeks to shift global perception by projecting itself as a victim of terrorism, demanding accountability from international institutions and neighbouring states.
- This also enhances India's image as a responsible power committed to the global fight against terror.

## 6. Lessons and Strategic Outlook

- Civil Society and Governance:
  - Civil society must play a role in resisting ideological extremism.
  - Democratic institutions should stay vigilant against politicization of terrorism.
- Global Partnerships:
  - India must strengthen partnerships in counter-terror frameworks like **FATF**, **Interpol**, and **UNSC**.
