WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

Overview of the India-Maldives Strategic Review

- Both countries' Foreign Ministers are reviewing the progress of the India–Maldives
 Comprehensive Economic and Maritime Security Partnership, based on a vision
 document adopted by PM Modi and the Maldivian President in 2023.
- The review reflects continued high-level engagement to enhance bilateral cooperation across economic, digital, health, energy, and security domains.

Key Highlights of the Vision Document

1. Bilateral Commitment and Financial Support

- India reaffirmed its commitment to the Maldives under its 'Neighbourhood First' policy and Vision SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region).
- As emergency financial assistance, India:
 - Rolled over \$100 million in Treasury bills.
 - Activated a currency swap arrangement worth \$400 million and an additional ₹30 billion line of credit to stabilize the Maldivian economy.

2. Framework for a Comprehensive Partnership

- A new, **strategic framework** for bilateral relations was established with a **people-centric** and future-oriented vision.
- The framework aims to make India and Maldives a **stabilizing force in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR)**.

3. Development Cooperation

- India is actively supporting **large-scale infrastructure development** in the Maldives, including:
 - Ports, airports, housing complexes, schools, roads, and hospitals.
- These projects aim to improve Maldivian living standards and regional connectivity.

4. Trade and Economic Cooperation

- Both sides are exploring the possibility of a **Bilateral Free Trade Agreement (FTA)**.
- Emphasis is being placed on:
 - Enabling local currency settlement to reduce dependency on the US dollar.
 - Enhancing **ease of doing business** and **promoting Indian investment** in diverse sectors of the Maldivian economy.

• Supporting **economic diversification** in areas like the **blue economy**, **fisheries**, and **oceanographic research**.

5. Collaboration on Digital Public Infrastructure

- India is extending its successful models in digital governance to the Maldives:
 - Integration of UPI (Unified Payments Interface), Digital ID systems, and Gati Shakti infrastructure tools.
 - Expansion of **RuPay card services** and digital payments.
 - Cooperation in fintech, cybersecurity, and digital governance.

6. Energy Cooperation

- Focus is on renewable energy collaboration, particularly solar power and energy efficiency.
- Maldives has joined India's One Sun, One World, One Grid (OSOWOG) initiative.
- Cooperation includes:
 - Joint research, training programs, and institutional collaboration in the energy sector.

7. Health Cooperation

- India is promoting access to **affordable healthcare services** and **generic medicines** for Maldivians through:
 - Setting up Jan Aushadhi Kendras.
 - Recognition of the **Indian Pharmacopoeia** to facilitate seamless pharmaceutical trade and regulation.

8. Regional and Multilateral Cooperation

- Both nations reaffirm commitment to regional security through:
 - Engagement in the Colombo Security Conclave (CSC) and other multilateral forums.
 - Cooperation on maritime safety, disaster response, and mutual representation in international platforms.

9. Implementation Mechanism

- A **High-Level Core Group (HLCG)** with senior government officials from both nations has been formed.
- This body will **monitor**, **coordinate**, and **ensure timely execution** of all cooperative initiatives outlined in the vision document.

Significance of the Comprehensive Partnership

1. Strengthening Regional Stability

• As China expands its strategic influence in the Indian Ocean, this partnership serves as a **counterbalancing force** to promote regional stability and maritime security.

2. Diplomatic Maturity

• Despite political turbulence in bilateral ties in recent years, both countries are demonstrating maturity and foresight by focusing on long-term strategic interests.

3. People-Centric Focus

• Initiatives in **healthcare**, **education**, **housing**, and **livelihood support** signify a commitment to **inclusive and sustainable development** in the Maldives.

4. Economic Sovereignty for Maldives

• Enabling **local currency trade** and supporting **economic diversification** empowers Maldives to reduce external economic vulnerabilities and build self-reliance.

5. Balanced Security Partnership

• India remains a **trusted security partner** while adapting its assistance to suit **Maldivian national interests and sovereignty**, avoiding coercive influence.

Highlights of Broader India-Maldives Relations

1. Participation in Regional Forums

- Both countries are:
 - Founding members of SAARC and the South Asian Economic Union.
 - Signatories to the South Asia Free Trade Agreement (SAFTA).

2. Economic Partnership

- In 2023, India became the **largest trade partner** of the Maldives.
- India is also:
 - Among the largest foreign investors in the country.
 - A top source market for Maldivian tourism and infrastructure development.

3. Defence and Security Cooperation

- Since 1988, India has supported Maldives in security matters, including:
 - Signing a Comprehensive Action Plan for Defence in 2016.
 - Providing around 70% of Maldivian defence training.
 - Assisting in capacity-building, surveillance, and maritime patrolling.

4. Tourism and Connectivity

- In 2023, India contributed **11.8% of tourist arrivals** in Maldives—the highest among all countries.
- The **India–Maldives Open Skies Agreement** (March 2022) has improved flight connectivity.

- The **Greater Male Connectivity Project (GMCP)** is India's largest development project in the Maldives:
 - Worth \$530 million, it links Male with Villingili, Gulhifalhu, and Thilafushi.
 - It plays a crucial role in **port development** and enhancing **economic integration**.

Way Forward

- Maldives is a **key maritime neighbor** and a central pillar of India's:
 - Neighbourhood First policy.
 - **Vision MAHASAGAR** (Mutual and Holistic Advancement for Security and Growth Across Regions).
- By addressing challenges and sustaining high-level engagement, India and Maldives can build a resilient, future-ready strategic partnership.
