NEWS: Recently the government notified rules under the Inter-Services Organisations (Command, Control & Discipline) Act, 2023, making the Act fully operational.

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

Key Rules under Inter-Services Organisations (Command, Control & Discipline) Act, 2023

• Empowerment of Commanders:

Commanders-in-Chief and Officers-in-Command of Inter-Service Organisations (ISOs) have been legally empowered with full **administrative and disciplinary authority** over personnel from the Army, Navy, and Air Force serving under their command.

• Legal Framework via Rules under Section 11:

Rules framed under **Section 11** provide a **comprehensive legal and procedural mechanism** to operationalize the Act. These rules define how command, control, and disciplinary jurisdiction will be exercised across inter-service formations.

• Expedited Disciplinary Proceedings:

The Act ensures **faster and more efficient disposal of disciplinary cases** by avoiding duplication of proceedings across services. It reduces inter-service procedural delays and bureaucratic hurdles.

• Preservation of Service-Specific Conditions:

The Act explicitly states that it does **not override the unique service conditions** (like pay, allowances, traditions, or recruitment systems) of the individual branches — Army, Navy, and Air Force. It harmonizes command structure without altering identity or internal rules of the services.

Implications of the Act on India's Military Structure

• Operational Synergy and Jointness:

The Act promotes **greater synergy in functioning** of inter-service formations, helping overcome traditional administrative silos. It lays the foundation for seamless cooperation and joint operations among the services.

• Strengthening of Theatre Command Framework:

It is a preparatory step toward **future Integrated Theatre Commands**. By empowering ISO commanders now, the Act ensures that **Theatre Commanders** will eventually have **unified operational and administrative control** over all personnel under their command.

• Cost Efficiency and Resource Optimization:

Unified command reduces **redundancy**, **duplication of infrastructure**, **and administrative processes**, thereby enhancing **cost-effectiveness** and optimal utilization of military resources.

What are Joint Theatre Commands?

• Definition:

Joint Theatre Commands are integrated military structures where the Army, Navy, and Air

Force function together under a single commander responsible for a specific geographical area or operational objective.

• Purpose:

Designed to enable **swift**, **coordinated**, **and decisive military responses** through integrated planning, logistics, and execution across all service branches.

What are Inter-Service Organisations (ISOs)?

• Definition:

ISOs are military structures comprising personnel from **at least two of the three defence services**. They are created to handle **common responsibilities** in logistics, training, medical services, or joint operations.

• Legal Basis:

The Inter-Services Organisations (Command, Control and Discipline) Act, 2023 authorizes the **central government** to establish such bodies and **vest command and disciplinary powers** in designated officers.

• Command Structure:

Each ISO is headed by an **Officer-in-Command** who exercises **full disciplinary and administrative control** over all tri-service personnel posted within the organization, regardless of their parent service.

• Example:

The **Andaman and Nicobar Command (ANC)** is India's first tri-service command and a model of integrated military functioning under a unified leadership.

India's Target and Strategic Vision

• Theaterisation for Jointness:

India aims to move towards **theaterisation of military commands**, wherein integrated theatre commands will be responsible for joint war-fighting across land, sea, and air domains.

• Enhancing Inter-operability:

Integration of commands enhances **inter-operability**, facilitates joint training and logistics, and improves real-time decision-making during conflict.

• 'One Nation, One Military Approach':

The long-term vision is to achieve a holistic and unified approach to national defence, with integrated command structures that can adapt to modern, multi-domain warfare.

Global Examples of Integrated Commands

• United States – USINDOPACOM:

The United States Indo-Pacific Command (USINDOPACOM) is a major joint command that exemplifies **tri-service coordination under a unified theatre command**, covering a vast strategic region.

• China's Theatre Commands:

China operates **five theatre commands**, each with control over all service branches in its area of responsibility, enabling **rapid deployment and joint operations**.

Military Integration Reforms in India

- Creation of the Chief of Defence Staff (CDS):
 - Established in **2019** to enhance coordination across Army, Navy, and Air Force.
 - Acts as a **single-point military advisor** to the government and oversees joint planning and capability development.

• Institutionalization of ISOs:

- Multiple ISOs have been created to manage logistics, medical services, and training in an integrated manner.
- The **2023** Act gives legal backing to their command structure and functioning.

• Planned Theatre Commands:

- Western and Eastern Theatre Commands (land-based) and a Maritime Theatre Command are in planning stages.
- These commands will have tri-service integration for faster mobilization and unified action.

Objective:

To create a modern, agile, technologically enabled military structure capable of handling 21st-century threats through jointness, integration, and unified command.
