## Introduction to Swachh Survekshan Grameen (SSG) 2025

# • Flagship Rural Sanitation Survey:

Swachh Survekshan Grameen (SSG) 2025 is a **nationwide rural sanitation survey** spearheaded by the **Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation (DDWS)** under the **Ministry of Jal Shakti**.

## • Largest Sanitation Survey in India:

It represents **India's largest assessment exercise** focused on rural cleanliness and sanitation outcomes.

#### Historical Context:

The first Swachh Survekshan was conducted in **2016**, evaluating **73 cities**, with **Mysuru** ranked the cleanest. The rural version (SSG) was introduced later to evaluate progress in the countryside.

### **Key Features of SSG 2025**

## Focus on ODF Plus Sustainability:

The survey emphasizes the need to sustain the gains of Open Defecation Free (ODF) status under Swachh Bharat Mission – Gramin (SBM-G) Phase II and promote villages to ODF Plus Model status.

#### • Comprehensive Assessment Design:

The survey will evaluate villages through:

- Household surveys
- Public space inspections
- Sampling-based village selection
- Direct observations and interviews

### • Core Evaluation Parameters:

SSG 2025 will assess sanitation progress using indicators such as:

- Operational status of Plastic Waste Management Units (PWMUs)
- Faecal Sludge Management (FSM) plants
- GOBARdhan bio-gas plants
- Swachhata Green Leaf Rating (SGLR) of community facilities
- Citizen feedback and awareness levels

# **Importance and Impact of SSG 2025**

## • Strengthening Rural Sanitation Ecosystem:

The survey supports India's goal of developing clean, healthy, and sustainable rural communities with active citizen engagement.

# • Inclusive and Participatory Governance:

It encourages collaborative participation of:

- Gram Panchayats
- Elected representatives
- Frontline sanitation workers
- Community members

# • Evidence-Based Policy Making:

Data collected will help refine and recalibrate rural sanitation policies and schemes, ensuring resource optimization and better outcomes.

# • Catalyst for Behavioral Change:

Through rankings and rewards, the survey promotes **competitive spirit and public awareness**, driving long-term behavioral transformation at the grassroots.

# Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM-G] Overview

- Phase I (2014–2019): Elimination of Open Defecation
  - Launched on **2nd October 2014** to eradicate **open defecation** in rural India.
  - By 2nd October 2019, the mission achieved:
    - 100% sanitation coverage
    - Construction of over 10 crore Individual Household Latrines (IHHLs)
    - Declaration of all villages as Open Defectation Free (ODF)
- Phase II (2020–2026): ODF Plus and Waste Management
  - Started on 1st April 2020, with the focus shifting to:
    - Sustaining ODF status
    - Implementing Solid and Liquid Waste Management (SLWM)
    - Transitioning all villages to ODF Plus status by 2025–26

## • ODF Plus Village Classification:

- Aspiring: Basic ODF Plus infrastructure present
- **Rising:** Infrastructure operational with partial behavior change
- Model: Fully functional sanitation systems with visible behavioral outcomes

#### **Swachh Bharat Mission**

#### **About:**

To accelerate the efforts to achieve universal sanitation coverage, the Prime Minister of India had launched the Swachh Bharat Mission on 2<sub>nd</sub> October 2014.

- Under the mission, all villages, Gram Panchayats, Districts, States and Union Territories in India declared themselves "Open-Defection Free" (ODF) by 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2019, the 150<sup>th</sup> birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, by constructing over 100 million toilets in rural India.
- SBM is **being implemented by** the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (M/o HUA) and by the Ministry of Jal Shakti for urban and rural areas respectively.
- In the Union Budget 2021-22, the Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) 2.0 was announced to be implemented over five years 2021 till 2026 with an outlay of Rs. 1.41 lakh crore.
- Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) Phase-II was launched in 2020.
- It further led to Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) for addressing water security.
- Schemes as part of SBM:
  - GOBAR-DHAN (Galvanizing Organic Bio-Agro Resources) Scheme: Launched by the Ministry of Jal Shakti in 2018 and aims to augment income of farmers by converting biodegradable waste into compressed biogas (CBG).
  - Individual Household Latrines (IHHL): Individuals get around 15 thousand for the construction of toilets.
  - Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan: The Ministry of Education launched the Swachh Vidyalaya Programme with an objective to provide separate toilets for boys and girls in all government schools within one year.
