INDIA - CROATIA REALTIONS

NEWS: Recently, the Indian Prime Minister paid a maiden visit to Croatia as part of the last leg of his three-nation tour, which included Cyprus and Canada.

• PM Modi expressed gratitude for Croatia's support following the Pahalgam terror attack, highlighting shared democratic values and commitment to combatting terrorism.

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

Defence and Security Cooperation

- Building upon the **2023 MoU on Defence Cooperation**, India and Croatia agreed to **expand military ties** through:
 - Joint military training programs aimed at capacity building and operational coordination.
 - **Personnel exchanges** to enhance interoperability and mutual understanding among armed forces.
 - **Industry-level partnerships** to facilitate collaboration between Indian and Croatian defence manufacturers.
 - **Cybersecurity cooperation**, particularly in areas of threat detection, cyber defence, and secure communication systems.
 - Promotion of **joint ventures in defence production**, aligning with India's 'Make in India' initiative.

Agreements and MoUs Signed

- Multiple Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) were signed in the areas of:
 - Agriculture: promoting joint R&D and trade in agri-products.
 - **Cultural exchange**: to boost artistic, educational, and heritage collaboration.
 - Science and Technology: enabling joint innovation and technological research.
- The ICCR Chair of Hindi at the University of Zagreb was extended until 2030, reaffirming India's commitment to language and cultural diplomacy.
- Launch of **joint academic research programs** and a **five-year cultural exchange initiative** to foster deeper people-to-people ties.

Investment and Economic Cooperation

- Both countries committed to **deepening investments** in priority sectors, including:
 - **Pharmaceuticals**, where India is already a major supplier to Europe.
 - Agriculture and agri-tech, with potential for knowledge-sharing and trade expansion.
 - Information and Digital Technologies, including IT services and cybersecurity.

- **Clean technology and semiconductors**, leveraging India's expanding capacity in chip manufacturing and renewable energy.
- Croatia was **invited to participate in India's Sagarmala Project**, aimed at enhancing portled development by utilising Croatia's maritime and logistics expertise.

Academic and Cultural Exchanges

- Expansion of joint research projects between Indian and Croatian academic institutions.
- Implementation of a **five-year cultural exchange program** to promote mutual understanding through arts, education, and heritage.
- Croatia's legacy in **Indology and Sanskrit studies** continues to be a strong bridge between the two cultures, with sustained scholarly interest and educational programs.

Space and Technology Collaboration

- India offered to share its expertise in space technologies with Croatia.
- Potential cooperation includes **satellite system development, space applications**, and **remote sensing**, enhancing Croatia's scientific capabilities and India's space diplomacy.

Enhanced Mobility and Diplomatic Mechanisms

- A Mobility Agreement is in the pipeline to facilitate travel, education, tourism, and business between the two nations.
- A framework for **regular high-level diplomatic consultations** was established, institutionalising momentum and improving coordination in bilateral and multilateral platforms.

Economic Facets of India–Croatia Relations

- Bilateral trade has been steadily growing, increasing from \$199.45 million in 2017 to \$337.68 million in 2023.
- India's key exports: pharmaceuticals, machinery, chemicals, apparel, and consumer goods.
- Croatia's main exports to India: precision instruments, chemicals, timber, rubber, and vegetable oils.
- Agreements such as the **Bilateral Investment Protection Agreement (2001)** and **India Croatia Economic Cooperation Agreement (2017)** provide a legal foundation for economic ties.
- The India–Croatia Startup Bridge (2021) fosters cooperation in cutting-edge fields like AI, robotics, and green technology.

Cultural Relations

• Croatia has a **long tradition of Indology**, with Sanskrit studies dating back to the 18th century.

- Croatian scholar **Ivan Filip Vezdin** published the **first printed Sanskrit grammar** in Europe in 1790.
- The **Indology Department at the University of Zagreb** is a vital institution promoting Indian culture, language, and philosophy.
- Yoga and Ayurveda have gained significant popularity, enhancing India's cultural soft power in Croatia.
- Historical ties include Croatian contributions to Indo-Portuguese architecture, notably the Church of São Brás in Goa.

Diplomatic Engagement

- India recognized Croatia's independence in May 1992, and diplomatic ties were formalized in July 1992.
- Embassies were established in Zagreb (1995) and New Delhi (1996); ambassadorial-level relations began in 1998.
- Croatia consistently supports India on global issues, including India's bid for permanent membership in the UN Security Council.
- Diplomatic relations have remained cordial, based on shared values of democracy, sovereignty, and non-intervention.

Strategic Significance of Croatia for India

- Geostrategic Gateway to Europe:
 - Located on the Eastern Adriatic coast, Croatia provides maritime access to the European Union.
 - Ports such as **Rijeka**, **Split**, **and Ploče** are crucial parts of the **EU's TEN-T transport corridor**, enabling entry to Central and Eastern European markets.
 - As a potential node in the India–Middle East–Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), Croatia offers a route to bypass logistical challenges in the Suez Canal and Red Sea.
 - Reduces India's **overdependence on Western European trade entry points** like Germany or France.
- Strategic Alternative to Chinese Influence:
 - Croatia has shown limited engagement with China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).
 - Its cautious stance on Chinese infrastructure investments makes it a **favourable partner for India** in the Balkans.
 - Enhancing India–Croatia cooperation contributes to offering a democratic, rulesbased alternative in the region.

- EU and NATO Connectivity:
 - Croatia's membership in both the European Union and NATO enhances its value as a diplomatic and strategic partner for India.
 - Offers India indirect access to EU decision-making processes and regulatory frameworks.
 - Serves as an ally within European consensus-building platforms, especially relevant for India–EU Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations.
- Multilateral Alignment and Reliability:
 - Croatia consistently supports India's positions in international forums.
 - Its non-interventionist posture on issues like Jammu & Kashmir aligns with India's diplomatic sensitivities.
 - Acts as a **stable and predictable partner**, contrasting with more fluctuating stances of larger EU powers.

Croatia



- Location: Situated in Southeastern Europe on the Balkan Peninsula.
- Bordering Nations: Hungary, Slovenia, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina
- Geographical Features:
 - **Topography**: Around half of Croatia is characterized by karst (limestone) terrain, especially prominent in the Dinaric Alps.
 - Major Mountain Range: Dinaric Alps (Dinara Highest point)
 - The country experiences both Mediterranean and continental climates.
