SHORT NEWS:

1. 2,000-year-old Buddhist Site Found in Haryana

- **Discovery:** IIT Kanpur found signs of ancient Buddhist stupas in Haryana's Yamuna Nagar district.
- **Method:** Used Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) to "see" buried structures like circular shapes and old walls, 6-7 feet deep.
- **Sites:** Found at Topra Kalan (likely a stupa) and 'Jarasandha ka Qila' (another circular structure).
- **Significance:** Could be 2,000 years old, maybe even from the Mahabharata era. Shows ancient trade and religious networks.
- **GPR:** A non-invasive technology using radar to image what's underground without digging.
- **Key Buddhist Sites (India & Nepal):** Lumbini (Nepal Buddha's birthplace), Bodh Gaya (Bihar enlightenment), Sarnath (UP first sermon), Kushinagar (UP final passing), Sanchi (MP stupas), Rajgir & Nalanda (Bihar learning centers), Vaishali (Bihar final sermon), McLeod Ganj (HP Tibetan Buddhist hub), Ellora & Ajanta Caves (Maharashtra rock-cut sites).

2. Prithvi-II & Agni-I Ballistic Missiles Test-Fired

- Event: India successfully test-fired short-range ballistic missiles Prithvi-II and Agni-I on July 17, 2025, from Chandipur, Odisha.
- **Purpose:** Boosts India's nuclear and air defence.
- Prithvi-II:
 - Type: Short-range, surface-to-surface, liquid-fueled.
 - Range: 250-350 km.
 - Payload: 500-1000 kg (conventional/nuclear).
 - **Developed by:** DRDO.
 - User: Indian Air Force (Strategic Forces Command).

• Agni-I:

- **Type:** Short to medium-range, solid-fueled.
- Range: 700-1200 km.
- Payload: 1000 kg (conventional/nuclear).
- **Developed by:** DRDO (after Kargil War).
- Mobility: Road and rail mobile.

- User: Indian Army (Strategic Forces Command).
- Future: Agni-1P (upgraded version) being developed.

3 Tawke Oilfield, Iraq

- Context: Drone strikes hit Tawke oilfield in Iraq's Kurdistan region on July 17, 2025, disrupting oil output.
- Location: Northern Iraq, in the Kurdistan Region (area primarily inhabited by ethnic Kurds).
- **Operator:** Norway's DNO.
- **Importance:** Significant oil production site (78,615 barrels/day in 2024).
- Iraq:
 - Location: Western Asia.
 - **Borders:** Turkey (N), Iran (E), Persian Gulf & Kuwait (SE), Saudi Arabia (S), Jordan (SW), Syria (W).

4. Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA)

- News: CARA issued new rules for mandatory counselling in adoptions.
- New Directives:
 - Mandatory Counselling: Required before, during, and after adoption.
 - Qualified Counsellors: State adoption boards must appoint trained professionals.
 - **Support:** Aims to help adoptive parents, adopted children (especially older ones), and biological parents.
 - **Specific Situations:** Counselling for root searches, adjustment issues, or potential adoption disruptions.
 - Legal Basis: Under Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 (amended 2021) and Adoption Regulations, 2022.

About CARA:

- **Apex Body:** India's top statutory body for adoption, under Ministry of Women & Child Development.
- Status: Gained statutory status through JJ Act 2015.
- **Role:** Monitors and regulates both in-country and international adoptions of orphan, abandoned, and surrendered children.
- **International Role:** Central Authority for inter-country adoptions under the Hague Convention (1993).

5.OECD-FAO Agricultural Outlook 2025-2034

- **Report:** Joint report by OECD and FAO assessing global agricultural prospects for the next 10 years.
- Key Global Trends (by 2034):
 - Cereal Use: Only 40% for human food; 27% for biofuel/industry; 33% for animal feed.
 - **Biofuel Growth:** 0.9% yearly growth, led by India, Brazil, Indonesia.
 - **Production Growth:** 1.1% yearly (mostly better yields). India and Southeast Asia drive 39% of cereal consumption growth.
 - **Animal Products:** Rising demand (especially in middle-income countries), leading to 17% more meat/dairy and 6% more agricultural GHG emissions.
 - Cotton: India expected to become the top producer, surpassing China.
- India's Agri-Marketing Challenges:
 - Weak Infrastructure: ₹92,000 crore in post-harvest losses due to poor cold storage/transport.
 - Fragmented Markets: No national integrated market; State-regulated APMCs.
 - Limited Access: Small farmers struggle to reach markets and get good prices.
- Indian Government Steps:
 - e-NAM: Online platform for price transparency.
 - **FPOs Scheme:** 10,000 Farmer Producer Organizations to link small farmers to markets.
 - **Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF):** Financial aid for post-harvest infrastructure (warehouses, cold chains).
 - Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure (AMI): Enhances rural storage capacity.

6.Senegal

- News: France handed back its last military bases in Senegal, ending its permanent military presence in West and Central Africa.
- Context: Sahel region faces growing jihadist conflict.
- About Senegal:
 - Capital: Dakar.
 - **Government:** Presidential Republic.

- Location: Westernmost Africa, bordered by Mauritania, Mali, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, and the Atlantic Ocean.
- Geography: Dominated by Sahara desert, Senegal River.
- Climate: Dry, hot, windy; desertification is a concern.
- **History:** Gained independence from France in 1960.
