SHORT NEWS

1. Singapore India Maritime Bilateral Exercise (SIMBEX)

- What: 32nd edition of Singapore-India Maritime Bilateral Exercise (SIMBEX).
- Who: Indian Navy (Eastern Fleet: INS Delhi, Satpura, Kiltan, Shakti) and Republic of Singapore Navy.
- Where: Singapore.
- When: Later this month (July 2025).
- **Significance:** Coincides with 60th anniversary of India-Singapore ties.

• Key Features:

- One of India's longest bilateral naval exercises.
- Formerly "Exercise Lion King."
- Evolved from anti-submarine warfare to broader maritime security roles.

Phases:

- Harbour Phase: Exchanges, visits, sports, coordination.
- **Sea Phase:** Advanced naval drills, live weapon firings, ASW, anti-surface/air ops, tactical manoeuvres.

2. Allographa Effusosoredica (New Lichen Species)

- **Discovery:** New lichen species, *Allographa effusosoredica*, found in the Western Ghats.
- Identified by: Scientists from MACS-Agharkar Research Institute, Pune (DST institute).
- **Funding:** Part of a research project funded by Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF, formerly SERB).

What are Lichens?

- Symbiotic association between algae (food producer) and fungi (shelter/absorber).
- Appear as a single organism.
- Excellent air quality indicators (don't thrive in pollution).
- Types: Foliose, Fruticose, Crustose.

• About A. effusosoredica:

- A crustose lichen with "effuse soredia."
- Contains **norstictic acid** (rare chemical trait).

- Algal partner: *Trentepohlia* species.
- Morphology mimics *Graphis glaucescens*, raising evolutionary questions.

• Significance of Discovery:

- First Indian *Allographa* species supported by molecular data.
- Supports theory of locally adapted photobionts.
- 53rd *Allographa* species reported from India.
- 22nd *Allographa* from the Western Ghats.

3. 8th Economic Census

- **Proposal:** Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) proposed conducting the **16th Population Census and 8th Economic Census jointly**.
- **Purpose:** To improve efficiency and reduce costs.
- Joint Execution Instances:
 - 2nd Economic Census (1980) with 1981 Population Census.
 - 3rd Economic Census (1990) with 1991 Population Census.
- Technology: Upcoming census will use an end-to-end digital data collection and processing system.
- **Previous Census Status:** 7th Economic Census (2019–2021) not yet released due to data quality issues and COVID-19 delays.

• What is Economic Census?

- Comprehensive count of all **non-farm economic establishments** in the country.
- Data used for research, analysis, policy formulation (economic growth, employment).

History:

- First Economic Census: 1977 (excluded Lakshadweep, covered non-agricultural establishments with at least one hired worker).
- Subsequent: 1980, 1990, 1998, 2005, 6th in 2013.

4. Wimbledon 2025

- Men's Singles Winner: Jannik Sinner (Italy) Maiden Wimbledon, fourth Grand Slam.
- Women's Singles Winner: Iga Swiatek (Poland) First Wimbledon, won 6-0, 6-0 (double bagel, second in Open Era Grand Slam final, first at Wimbledon).

• Other Winners (2025):

- Men's Doubles: Julian Cash & Lloyd Glasspool (GBR)
- Women's Doubles: Veronika Kudermetova (RUS) & Elise Mertens (BEL)
- Mixed Doubles: Sem Verbeek (NED) & Kateřina Siniaková (CZE)

• About Wimbledon:

- World's oldest and most prestigious tennis tournament.
- Annual, late June/early July, Wimbledon, London, UK.
- Only Grand Slam played on natural grass courts.
- First edition: 1877 (men's singles only).

• Grand Slam Tournaments (The Four Majors):

- Australian Open: Mid-Jan, Hard Courts.
- French Open (Roland Garros): May–June, Clay Courts.
- Wimbledon: June–July, Natural Grass Courts.
- US Open: Aug-Sept, Hard Courts.
- Top 3 Men Grand Slam Titles (Singles): Novak Djokovic (24), Rafael Nadal (22), Roger Federer (20).
- Top 3 Women Grand Slam Titles (Singles): Margaret Court (24), Serena Williams (23), Steffi Graf (22).

5. Slovenia

- **Context:** Parliament legalized assisted dying for terminally ill adults (after public referendum).
- Location: Central European country.
 - Northern and Eastern Hemispheres.
 - Capital: Ljubljana.
 - Borders: Austria (N), Hungary (NE), Italy (W), Croatia (SE).
 - Coastline: 47-km along Adriatic Sea (SW).
- Capital: Ljubljana (cultural, economic, administrative hub).

Geography:

• Area: 20,271 sq. km.

- 40%+ mountainous: Julian, Kamnik-Savinja, Karavanke, Pohorje Alps.
- Highest Point: Triglav Peak (2,864 m).
- Major Rivers: Drava, Sava, Mura.
- Kras (Karst) region: Part of Dinaric Alps, known for caves/underground rivers.
- Slovene Littoral: Short Adriatic coastline.
- **Forests:** Over 50% of territory (3rd most forested in Europe).

• International Memberships:

- European Union (EU) adopted Euro.
- North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO).

6.US designates The Resistance Front as Terrorist Organisation

- Context: US designated The Resistance Front (TRF) as a terrorist organization.
- **Reason:** Claimed responsibility for Pahalgam terror attack (killed 25 tourists, 1 local).

About TRF:

- Shadow outfit of Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).
- Formed after abrogation of Article 370 (Aug 5, 2019) to give Kashmir militancy an "indigenous appearance."
- Emerged during Pakistan's FATF grey list scrutiny (to avoid direct LeT/Jaish attribution; also People's Anti-Fascist Front PAFF).
- First known attack: Grenade attack in Srinagar (Oct 2019) post-Article 370 revocation.
- Rapid rise by mid-2020.
- Operates jointly with other outfits, blurred boundaries.
- Uses aliases (Kashmir Fight, Kashmir Tigers), but cadres are the same.

• Impact of US Designation:

- Asset Freezing: TRF assets under U.S. jurisdiction frozen; allies may follow.
- **Ban on Material Support:** Illegal for U.S. persons to provide funds, training, shelter.
- Travel/Visa Restrictions: TRF members face U.S. travel bans.
- Global Financial Scrutiny: Banks worldwide likely to flag/block suspicious transactions.
