WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

India and the UAE held the 13th Joint Defence Cooperation Committee (JDCC) meeting in New Delhi to deepen defence ties through joint manufacturing, technology co-development, and maritime collaboration. This reflects a broader strategic partnership encompassing regional security, defence innovation, and India's export ambitions.

13th India-UAE Joint Defence Cooperation Committee (JDCC) Meeting

- The 13th JDCC meeting was held in **New Delhi**, reaffirming both nations' commitment to **enhancing bilateral defence cooperation**.
- The meeting highlighted **joint production**, **technology co-development**, and **institutional collaboration** in key maritime and defence areas.

Key Outcomes of the 13th JDCC Meeting

Joint Manufacturing

- India and UAE decided to **replicate the ICOMM–CARACAL model** (collaboration in small arms manufacturing).
- Focus on boosting defence industrial collaboration and indigenisation under India's 'Make in India' and Atmanirbhar Bharat vision.

Technology Co-Development

- Agreement to co-develop next-gen defence technologies in:
 - Artificial Intelligence (AI)
 - Autonomous platforms
 - Cybersecurity systems
- Reflects a shift toward **technology-sharing partnerships** rather than just arms transactions.

MoU between Indian Coast Guard & UAE National Guard

- Deepened cooperation in:
 - Search and Rescue (SAR)

- Anti-piracy operations
- Pollution control response
- Maritime Situational Awareness
- Enhances maritime domain interoperability and operational synergy.

Strategic Significance of the Defence Cooperation

Regional Stability and Trust

- India's balanced foreign policy in West Asia positions it as a non-hegemonic stabilising force.
- Builds trust among Gulf nations and contributes to de-escalating regional conflicts.

Maritime Security Collaboration

- UAE's strategic location near the Strait of Hormuz complements India's naval presence in the Arabian Sea.
- Strengthens:
 - Sea lane safety
 - Anti-piracy surveillance
 - Maritime trade route protection

Boost to India's Defence Exports

- Defence collaboration aligns with India's export target of ₹35,000 crore by 2025.
- Promotes indigenous defence production, capacity-building, and export partnerships.

Overview of India-UAE Bilateral Relations

Political and Strategic Ties

- Diplomatic relations established in **1972**.
- Defence cooperation governed by the **2003 Agreement on Defence Cooperation**, effective from 2004.
- Regular ministerial-level engagements under JDCC framework.

Multilateral & Plurilateral Platforms

• Both countries are part of key strategic groupings:

- I2U2 (India-Israel-UAE-USA)
- **UFI Trilateral** (UAE–France–India)
- UAE was a **Guest Country at G20 India Summit**, showing its diplomatic proximity to India.

Economic & Trade Engagements

- Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) signed in 2022.
- Post-CEPA impact:
 - **Bilateral trade nearly doubled** from USD 43.3 billion (2020–21) to USD 83.7 billion (2023–24).
- UAE is India's second-largest export destination (after the US) \$31.61 billion in 2022–23.
- A new **Bilateral Investment Treaty (BIT)** was signed in 2024 to encourage and safeguard investments.

Space Cooperation

- ISRO and UAE Space Agency MoU (2016):
 - Cooperation in peaceful uses of outer space.
 - Focus on **satellite launches**, space R&D, and training.

Defence Exercises

- **Desert Cyclone 2024** marked a major milestone in joint military exercises.
- Symbolises high-level military interoperability and trust.

Indian Diaspora in UAE

- Indian community in UAE is approximately **3.5 million** strong.
- Constitutes 35% of UAE's population, forming the largest expatriate group.
- Acts as a **people-to-people bridge** between the two nations.

Conclusion: Strategic Maturity in India-UAE Partnership

- India—UAE defence ties now span joint manufacturing, innovation, maritime security, and regional stability.
- The cooperation supports India's aim of a rules-based multipolar order in:

- West Asia
- Indo-Pacific region
- The partnership contributes to **strategic autonomy**, **economic security**, and a **collaborative regional architecture**.
