1. US President Donald Trump announced that 25 percent tariff and penalty will be imposed on Indian goods from August 1, 2025.
2. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will present the International Prize for Food and Peace in the name of agricultural scientist Dr. M.S. Swaminathan on his centenary celebrations. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the centenary celebrations of Dr. M.S. Swaminathan in Pusa, Delhi on August 7, 2025.
3. Canada announced to recognize Palestine as a separate state. Among the G7 countries, a group of the world's most powerful nations, France was the first to recognize Palestine as a separate state.
4. Tamil Nadu Government has released the Tamil Nadu State 'Transgender Policy 2025' recognizing the transgender community, which has long been marginalized in society, needs deep, structured changes.
5. The Supreme Court Collegium recommended the transfer of Justice D. Vinodh Kumar, who was a judge of the Telangana High Court, to the Madras High Court. Accepting this recommendation, the President ordered his transfer to the Madras High Court. Accordingly, Chief Justice of Madras High Court, M.M. Srivastava administered the oath of office to Justice D. Vinodh Kumar.
6. The 'Nalam Kaakum Stalin' scheme will be launched on Aug. 2, 2025. Under this scheme, medical camps were planned to be conducted at a cost of Rs.12.78 crore to provide high-quality medical services.
7. Myanmar's military has announced that it is lifting the state of emergency it declared four and a half years ago. Although Army Chief of Staff Min Aung Hlaing will relinquish the posts of National Council Chairman and Prime Minister after the emergency is lifted, he will continue to retain power as the country's president and chairman of the newly formed National Security and Peace Commission.
8. Following nationwide protests against the controversial anti-corruption bill in Ukraine, the bill was passed by parliament with several amendments. The law will ensure the independent functioning of anti-corruption agencies.
9. Pakistan successfully launched its new remote sensing satellite (PRSS-1) from the Xichang Space Center in China's Sichuan Province. The satellite will help monitor climate change threats. The operational satellite, launched by China's Guizhou-1A rocket, was put into Earth orbit with the technical assistance of the Pakistan Space Research Organization.
