1. At the investors' conference held in Hosur, Krishnagiri district, in the presence of Chief Minister M.K. Stalin, 92 MoUs were signed to provide employment to 49,353 people with an investment of Rs.24,307 crore.
  - i. At the Investors' Conference held in Hosur, on behalf of the Department of Industry, Investment Promotion and Commerce, as many as 53 MoUs with an investment of Rs.23,303 crore, providing employment to 44,870 persons and
  - ii. on behalf of Micro small and medium enterprises department, 39 MoUs for providing employment to 4,483 persons with an investment of Rs.1,003.85 crore. Totally 92 MoUs signed for providing employment to 49,353 persons with an investment of Rs.24,307 crore.
  - iii. Tidal Park is being established in Hosur, covering 5 lakh square feet, at an estimated cost of Rs.400 crore. This world-class IT park will attract IT companies and start-ups, creating jobs for nearly 6,000 youth.
  - iv. The Chief Minister had earlier announced that an international airport with world-class state-of-the-art facilities would be built on about 2,000 acres in Hosur. A suitable site for this new airport has been identified and TIDCO has taken steps to acquire it. The Chief Minister said that this international airport will set Hosur on another new path of development.
2. C.P. Radhakrishnan (67) will take oath as the country's 15th Vice President on Friday (September 12).
  - i. President Draupadi Murmu will administer the oath of office to him at a ceremony to be held at the Rashtrapati Bhavan at 10 am.
  - ii. Elections for the post were held last Tuesday (September 9) after Jagdeep Dhankhar, who was the Vice President, resigned from his post on July 21.
3. The 'Gen Z' group, led by youths who staged a massive protest against the government in Nepal, demanded the dissolution of the parliament and the amendment of the constitution in accordance with the wishes of the people.
4. Tata Advanced Systems Limited (DASL) has become the first private company in the country to manufacture and supply a state-of-the-art three-dimensional air surveillance radar (3D-ASR – 'Lanza-N') for use by the Indian Navy.
  - i. This radar has the ability to accurately track and identify enemy drones, supersonic aircraft capable of traveling faster than sound, and anti-radiation missiles. It was reported that this is the first time India has put this Lanza-N type radar into use after Spain.
5. The Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is scheduled to visit Manipur on Saturday (September 13), is expected to inaugurate development projects worth Rs.8,500 crore there, officials said.

- i. This is the first visit by the Prime Minister to Manipur since ethnic clashes between the Maithili community and the Kuki tribe began in 2023. More than 250 people have died in the ethnic clashes so far. Thousands of homeless people continue to stay in relief camps.
- ii. Preparations for the Prime Minister's event are underway at the Kangla Fort complex in the capital Imphal and at the Peace Ground in Surachandpur (an area largely inhabited by the Kuki tribe). The 237-acre Kangla Fort was the center of power for the ancient rulers of Manipur. Surrounded by moats on three sides and the Imphal River on one side, the fort complex houses a large polo field, a small forest, ruins of ancient temples, and archaeological offices.
6. The Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated India's first-ever circumnavigation of the globe in a sailboat piloted by female sailors from the three services.
  - i. The expedition, named Samudra Prathakshina, will see 10 women travel 26,000 nautical miles for 9 months, crossing some of the world's most important and dangerous seas.
  - ii. The naval expedition, which began on Thursday from the Gateway of India in Mumbai, was flagged off online by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh.
7. Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that India and Mauritius are working together to conduct bilateral trade in the currencies of both countries. The Prime Minister made this statement after bilateral talks with Mauritian Prime Minister Naveen Chandra Ramakoolam in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh.
  - i. UPI and RuPay cards were introduced in Mauritius last year. We are now working together to facilitate bilateral trade in local currency.
  - ii. Energy security is a key pillar of bilateral cooperation. India will support the installation of a 17.5 MW floating solar power system at the Tamarind Falls in Mauritius.
